## ***From the Principal...***

### ***CASTLE HILL SHOW***

Congratulations to all of the students who entered the Castle Hill Show competitions. Those of us who attended were able to see a great range of entries and we had many successful students. The entries were returned to school yesterday and displayed for all the students to see. The Show would be much poorer if our students did not support it so well. Thank you to the parents who generously gave their time to transport entries to and from the showground.

The conduct of our students attending the show was excellent. Thank you to the parents who volunteered to take a group of students. Breaking into smaller group makes access significantly better for all.

The only disappointment at the show was the number of students who took the opportunity to use money, provided by their families for showbags, to purchase guns. While we do not prescribe what toys students can have, it is disappointing to see students playing with guns and pointing them at others, even in play. We will be specifying next year that these cannot be purchased while students are with the school.

### ***STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT***

We had three students, Emma (6G), Hamish (6/5A) and Sophia (6G) who recently represented the Castle Hill Zone at the Regional Basketball Championships. Both teams were very successful. Each won the Sydney West Carnival. Emma has been selected to represent Sydney West at the State Carnival. Congratulations to these three students.

### ***BAKAGON TOYS***

Last year we advised that students were to bring no more than two of these toys on any day to school. They are also to take home only the ones they bring to school. They may not trade, swap, sell or buy them. This requirement still applies. We do not wish to restrict student play, but we have an ongoing problem with ownership of these toys.

We now have 50 families receiving their newsletter by email only. That is 25% of our target for reduction. ### ***BUILDING THE EDUCATION REVOLUTION (BER)***

This week saw the first stages of the additional maintenance program paid by BER. The cleaning of demountable gutters and fascias will be followed by the painting of those areas. The gutters, fascias and eaves of the permanent buildings will also be cleaned under this program and there will be some external painting work undertaken. The students and teachers have demonstrated great patience and tolerance of the disruption to their work patterns created by this additional work.

### ***HARMONY DAY***

Tomorrow is Harmony Day. We will be celebrating cultural diversity and tolerance across the school for the day. We are very proud of the multicultural nature of our school. It is something that has happened over a relatively short time. The values our students demonstrate is matched only by their level of acceptance of others regardless of cultural background. The students reflect the society in which their school works and demonstrate the values that will ensure a cohesive future for Australia.

Students are invited to wear national costume tomorrow. For students not wearing national costume, an invitation is extended to wear something orange, the colour for Harmony Day, with their school uniform. Please note that this is not a mufti day. School uniform must be worn by those who do not have an acknowledged national dress.

### ***RETIREMENT***

This week is the last at Castle Hill Public School for Robyn Campion. Robyn has been manager of our After School Care Centre for twenty years. In that time she has seen several generations of students pass through the school. She has worked with three principals and many executive, teaching and office staff and with hundreds of parents who have depended on her for the care of their children.

Robyn saw the ASC through its expansion at our old site, the move to the new site, the establishment of the centre at our current site and its expansion and modernisation of management practices. She has had many staff pass through her centre and has worked with a number of parent committees and sometimes has needed to continue the service without the active participation of a committee. Robyn worked through the difficult time when she was carer for her sick husband and continued her service when he passed away. Even a serious health setback several years ago could not dampen her enthusiasm for working with our students, her children.

I have had many opportunities to work with Robyn over more than a decade. Her retirement will be a loss to the school. I am sure that you join me in wishing Robyn well for her retirement.

### ***PEER SUPPORT PROGRAM***

Today was the training day for the Peer Support Program. All Year Five and Six students undertake this training as part of their syllabus. The program supports student leadership in the school. All Year Six students and selected Year Five students will lead small groups of students from Kindergarten to Year Five in the Peer Support Program in Term Two. We have an expectation that all of our students will take leadership roles in a number of areas in their final year. This will be one of the most significant for a majority of senior students. Completion of this program is also a mandatory requirement for the award of Gold Student status.

Earth Hour began in Sydney in 2007, when 2.2 million homes and businesses switched off their lights for one hour. 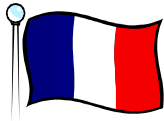

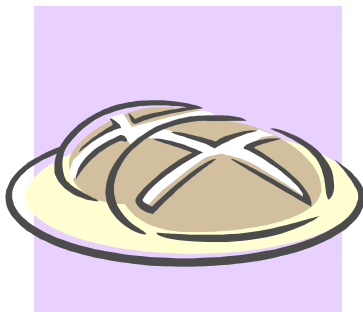
